

In our previous Hunt Prep discussions, we discussed being prepared for your hunt from a physical standpoint, recommended gear, and what your hunt day's will look like. Today, we would like to discuss a couple other areas of importance everyone should be prepared for, so let jump into it:

Bear Licenses (Mountain Hunts Only - Does not apply to Eastern Plains Hunts): We charge a fee for bear combo hunts of \$1,500. We have an overabundance of bears in our area, so much so, that CPW has made the licenses available for all hunters versus an application basis. We would like to extend this offer to all of our clients, if you would like to purchase a bear license you will only be charged if you harvest a bear, miss a shot at a bear, or tag out on your elk or deer and start to hunt a bear.

(Does not apply to Pronghorn or Moose, no bear seasons open during either of those two species seasons).

With an abundance of bears in our area, they are still difficult to find. If you are up for the challenge and would like to take advantage of this offer. Please let me know if you would like to jump on this and I will add it to our schedule. Bear License cost varies from year to year, starting 2024 the Non-Resident Bear License is \$500 and around \$150 for a Colorado Resident
